Providence smiled upon us; inclement weather led to the cancellation of the Grossman House dedication. As a result, two College VPs, non-DKE trustees, and several other administrators attended our extremely successful reception. Afterwards, the Rho House Association received compliments about our students, and that this event is exactly the type the College hopes fraternities can contribute.

Following the annual meeting, the students hosted an alumni tailgate on the Markle Parking Deck before the football game (Lafayette 30, Holy Cross 13). 5TH MEMORIAL B-BALL TOURNAMENT HUGE SUCCESS

On Saturday, March 6, the brothers of the Rho Chapter of Delta Kappa Epsilon hosted the 5th Annual Jeremy Saxe Memorial 3v3 Basketball Tournament in the Kamine Gym of the Kirby Sports Center. Teams spent the week signing up and preparing for either the competitive or noncompetitive bracket, both of which received a large turnout.

The noncompetitive bracket was won by brothers Dan Toutoungi '13, Will Brandt '13 and Andrew O'Brien '13 (below left), who relied on tenacious defense to win the championship trophy.

The competitive bracket featured several marquee matchups. Lafayette basketball star Tony Johnson teamed up with two members of the Lafayette football team, while Bryce Scott, another member of the basketball team, headlined a team of his own. The two squads met in the championship game. With a large crowd on hand, the highly competitive game did not disappoint, but in the end, the rookies were no match for Johnson and company. Brothers Rob Howe '14, Michael Kelley '14, and Charles Roberts '14 (below right) finished in third place.

DKE would like to send a heartfelt thank you to everyone who showed up to participate and to those who worked to make this event possible. Just shy of \$8000-the most money raised of the five tournaments to date-was raised for the Jeremy Saxe Foundation, which was created in honor of brother Jeremy Saxe '09 who passed away during his senior year at Lafayette because of an undiagnosed heart condition. The foundation's mission is to strengthen education and development in Nepal, where Saxe studied abroad during his Junior year. The foundation awards educational scholarships to underprivileged children, has built a daycare center so that young mothers can continue their education, and is in the process of building a K-6 elementary school.

As of the last issue of the Rho News, we were awaiting the court to make their decision. The court ruled against Chi Phi. Their alumni are appealing this ruling, and we now await the results of this appeals process.

LAGGL Progress

Last August DKE alumni leadership published a dashboard we use to track progress towards implementing the Board's 23 directives to strengthen Greek Life at Lafavette College. We are pleased to report considerable progress.

Under the new leadership of Vice President Annette Diorio, the Implementation and Assessment Group on Greek Life (IAGGL) refocused on implementing the Board of Trustees' Directives to strengthen Greek Life. In short, Annette reported to the Board that our community made significant progress towards achieving the Board's end goals, having already achieved those goals in some cases. She also published an implementation grid that identifies the person responsible for each item, including those planned for implementation next year.

Of great interest are the changes underway now surrounding the conduct system under the stewardship of Greg Meyer, the new Director of Student Development. He will be reporting to IAGGL on the new training in the conduct process, which dovetails with the recommended shift from the old punitive conduct model towards one focused on education and student development.

This shift is a monumental one that is necessary to promote student well being and treat groups like ours fairly and equitably. The hopes we discussed in our last issue are coming to fruition. (continued on page 6)

DKE SUMMIT

The Summit is a new gathering for Dekes that will take place biennially, in the off-years between International Conventions. The inaugural Summit will be held August 1-4th at Kappa Chapter (Miami University) in Oxford, Ohio. DKE International was seriously considering hosting the event at Rho, but learned last-minute that Lafayette would be unable to host the event this summer. The Summit's curriculum will have a focus on leadership, with prominent DKE alumni from different fields holding panel discussions on topics that relate to both the business world and the functioning of a DKE chapter. Headquarters is subsidizing the cost, so a nomination from an alumnus or Brother Beta and a formal application is required from each potential delegate. The Lion Trophy will be awarded at a formal banquet hosted by Kappa Chapter alumni on Saturday, August 3rd.

KIEFER '95, THOMSON '98 HOST LAW SCHOOL PRESENTATION

On Wednesday, April 3, the brothers of the Rho Chapter of Delta Kappa Epsilon, along with the Lafayette Government and Law Department and the Office of the Dean of the College, sponsored a presentation titled "Full Disclosure: Perspectives and Advice on Law School and the Legal Profession." **David W**. **Kiefer '95** and **Fletcher C. Thomson '98**, both DKE alumni, conducted the presentation and conveyed to aspiring potential law school students the benefits and challenges that come with the legal profession. Kiefer and Thomson provided a detailed insight into their experiences through law school, from the application process to the steps after graduation.



Upon completion of the presentation, the students left with a deeper understanding of how to approach a potential application to a law school. This presentation is another example of how the brothers of Delta Kappa Epsilon are attempting to connect with the student body to provide learning experiences for the entire campus.

<u>Laf360</u>

Laf360 is a new initiative the Board of Trustees recently kicked off to improve the student experience at Lafayette College. Two Dekes serve on the Steering Committee. JB Reilly '83 serves as the Trustee Representative and Michael De Lisi '03 serves as the Alumni Association Representative.

<u>Unrecognized Groups</u>

The Board of Trustees recently adopted a policy prohibiting students from using campus resources or otherwise engaging with unrecognized fraternities and sororities while on campus. We re-published the <u>full policy here</u> along with the accompanying <u>FAQ here</u>. Unrecognized groups detract from recognized chapters on campus like DKE, but, although well intentioned, we believe this policy was unnecessary. We need a framework for recognition driven by student demand, interest, and ability to advance the Mission of the College. In the past year, there have been 10 chapters seeking to partner with the College to either recolonize or bring a new chapter to campus, including several culturally based groups.

It makes no sense for the Board to keep the College's doors closed while there is clearly more student demand than the current chapters can meet, causing student suffering as a result of the moratorium on recognizing new chapters. Hopefully the Board will permit the administration to work with these groups to create the strongest possible applications for eventual Board review after their decision in the Spring of 2014.
